Dick Arthur and Heidi went to the deaccessioning of items at the Hagen History Center at which time Heidi found a typewriter, a small rocking horse and some other items to add to the collection. Dick is cleaning up the wooden items so they can be placed on display.

Dick Arthur is going to work to make the second and third floor of the Eagle into a true history of the area. He will start with the second floor,

and have each room tell a specific story. He was told that the organs that we have in the Eagle are just furniture. When money is available to get heat and air to the 3rd floor work will be done there.

Washington Park and the Teaching Garden are basically shut down for the winter season. Water has been shut off.

The FLB Center is continuing to host a household sale. In lieu of rent they are paying us 10% of the total sales. We did purchase shelving that they had that we needed, plus commercial sized Christmas decorations and a Jenn-Air grill that we can use for events for the Historical Society. Jesse Fiske gave us an estimate of \$13,000 to build a single, ADA compliant bathroom. We will need to earn the money to pay for the money to match any grant we receive. ½ of the golf outing money is designated for this.

There will be no Witches Tea this year.

The Museum and Judson House are hosting the Haunted Trail at Fort LeBoeuf on October 31 from 4-8. This is a free event.

We are again taking orders for wreaths. \$28. Contact Judy.

We are selling tickets on a tip board to benefit the FLB center. See Kathy Williams or anyone at the Gift Shop. \$10 a tip.

We purchased a machine to enable us to print our own t-shirts.

Cindy is working on a calendar. She will advise when it is ready.

We received a letter from Rosalee Holzer indicating that the dining room set that was in the room at the Eagle can be sold. She would like the proceeds to go the Judson House.
